

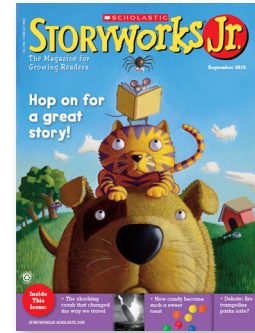
STORYWORKS Jr. at Home

Here are some more activities you can do with the magazine at home to build your son's or daughter's reading and thinking skills:



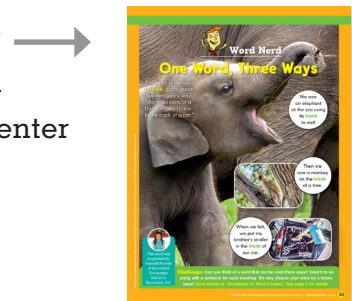
